



EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS

The Holocaust Museum of Southwest Florida has been an educational resource in Southwest Florida since 2001. Stated in its mission, the Holocaust Museum promotes tolerance and understanding by teaching the history and lessons of the Holocaust.

In order to assist teachers in meeting the State of Florida mandate to teach the Holocaust, the museum offers several program options, both in the museum and as outreach.

MUSEUM PROGRAMS

- ✓ *Designed for grades 7–12*
- ✓ *2 hours in duration (2.5 hours preferred)*
- ✓ *Best fit for 30 students*
- ✓ *Museum tour + workshop activity*
- ✓ *\$2.00 per student due at program/check payable to the Holocaust Museum of Southwest Florida*

Constructing the Past introduces students to the methodology of researching artifacts and creating the historical narrative. Coupled with a 50-minute museum tour, this program will have students evaluating historical items and drawing out the larger story behind each.

To Save One Life introduces students to people who risked their lives to stand up for what was right. Through readings and small group discussions, students will learn about individuals and communities that understood that saving one person meant saving the world.

Genocide in Our Lifetime exposes students to acts of genocide that have occurred since the Holocaust, with attention to the past 15 years. Using the museum tour and small group activities, students will discuss the role of individuals as well as the international community in these events.

Survivor or Liberator Presentation Several Holocaust survivors and liberators generously offer to speak with student groups each year. The museum will assist in making these arrangements.

Genocide and the Holocaust is a power point presentation of a five step process that can lead to genocide, using the Holocaust as the key event, then moving on to Bosnia, Rwanda and Darfur.

Hana's Suitcase is a power point presentation designed for grades 4 – 6. It focuses on Hana Brady and the search to find out who she was.

The Journey that Saved Curious George is a story telling program designed for grades 1 – 3. It traces the true story of Hans and Margret Rey as they fled from Nazi-occupied Europe along with their ideas for the Curious George stories.

TRAVELING EXHIBITS

- ✓ *Can be rented for one or two weeks*
- ✓ *Good preparation for a survivor/liberator visit*

The Holocaust: History and Memory is a traveling exhibit consisting of 17 panels, 20" x 30", and the accompanying table-top easels. The panels explain the Holocaust through historical context, personal testimony, archival images and the Museum's collection.

Rental fee: 1 week - \$40; 2 weeks - \$75

Genocide Through the Eyes of Children is a traveling exhibit consisting of 11 panels, 16" x 20", and the accompanying stands. Covering the Holocaust, Bosnia, Rwanda and Darfur, this display uses images, journals and drawings of and by children to shed light on genocide.

Rental fee: 1 week - \$25; 2 weeks - \$45
